Pastor's Column

We usually think of Christmas season as the days leading up to the climax of Christmas Day. But in the church calendar Christmas is just the <u>beginning</u> of a 12-day season that runs to Epiphany on Jan 6.

According to legend, the song **The Twelve Days of Christmas** was used in the centuries of persecution in Catholic England as a secret teaching tool for children about the basics of the faith. So in this legend each of the gifts had hidden meaning that was taught to the children. One partridge in a pear tree represents the One, Jesus Christ.

Two turtledoves represent the two testaments of the Bible.

Three French hens recall the three virtues of faith, hope and charity.

Four calling birds recall the four gospels

Five golden rings represent the five books of the law.

Six geese point to the six days of creation.

Seven swans point to either the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit or possibly the seven sacraments in the Catholic Church.

Eight maids stand in for the eight beatitudes

Nine ladies point to nine fruits of the spirit.

Ten lords stand in for the 10 commandments.

Eleven pipers point to the eleven remaining apostles.

Twelve drummers drum for the twelve articles of the Apostles creed.

So remember the Twelve Days of Christmas this year and these important church teachings. In this less busy time following Christmas day, use this hymn to continue your reflection on the meaning of Christmas, what we have learned this Advent and how we will adjust our lives and priorities to hold this Christmas story of Jesus, Emmanuel, God come near us, at the center or our lives.
