Free Bible Challenge

If you are willing to take the challenge to read "Through the BIBLE Made Easy" I will provide a copy at no charge to you. I only ask that after reading it, if you do not intend to read it again, you pass it on to someone else. These are some things I have done to make reading through the Bible easier:

- Removed excessive detail that does not alter the basic message consider the description of the Tent of Meeting, Temple and the various sacrifices.
- Removed the genealogy passages and put them as charts in the Appendix.
- Added a chart showing the relationships of the kings of Judah^J and Israel^I to the Appendix. In the text they are identified by superscripts as above.
- Combined duplicate or near duplicate material.
- Combined the four Gospels. Some liberty was required to mesh differing accounts of events and to determine the chronology.
- Removed some parallel phrases and flowery language that makes following the train of thought difficult.

Noisy Change Offering

The Noisy Change Offering for October will go to the Representative Payee Program which is a program that helps individuals, who have Social Security benefits paid to them because of a diagnosis of mental illness or a developmental disability, manage their money. This program was started by Episcopal Social Services and has been in place for 20 years. The Representative Payee Program at St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in Newton serves 135 clients in Newton, Salina, McPherson, Hutchinson and Greensburg. This program helps people from becoming homeless because the rent and utilities are always paid and the clients have money for food. There is one person who write checks for the client, another person who enters checks into a computer accounting system, and a third person who reconciles those numbers with the client's bank statements. The Representative Payee Program employs three people on a part—time basis and has 30 volunteers who spend one to two hours a week meeting with clients. The volunteers come from St. Matthew's as well as other area churches in the community. For more information about the program or to volunteer, call 316-283-3465.

From The Pastor

A pastor tells of her 4-year old grandson and his first interaction with her cat when he came to visit. He had not been around cats before. The cat jumped up in the chair where the boy was watching TV. The pastor thought "great, they are going to get along fine," as the cat curled up in his lap and began to purr. But then she noticed that the boy was holding his arms away from the cat instead of petting it, "Why is she growling at me," he asked. Grandma had to explain the difference between a growl and a purr. She had heard the purr and thought that all was well; he had heard a growl and was afraid. Sometimes our reality depends on how we look at things, doesn't it. We see clouds and we can think how great it will be to get some refreshing moisture that renews the grass and crops; or we can fear the coming storm and the wind damage or flooding it might bring. We can see a new person and think of the possibility of a new friend; or we can see a stranger and fear the unknown. How we look at things makes a big difference.
