Pastor's Column

Brothers and sisters.

Lent season is leading us slowly but surely toward the glorious day of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through his resurrection, He sealed once for all the defeat of the enemy. Resurrection is the victory to all who believe in him and good news that assures eternity for those who remain faithful to Him. The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the good news Apostle Paul received by the power of the Holy Spirit and made sure he passed it on. He reminds the Corinthians that it is by this gospel they are saved if they hold firmly to the word he preached to them. Again, in John 11:25-26 Jesus reminds Martha, the sister of his friend Lazarus that He is the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Him will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Him will never die.

Christianity is neither the way of life nor a kind of ethic. Christianity has nothing to do with an organization or a system. It has to do with the person of Jesus who died, was buried and was raised from the dead. His body that died, was buried, and was raised the third day. Jesus did not resuscitate, but He resurrected from the dead. Resuscitation differs from resurrection in that a person who is resuscitated will eventually face physical death again. Lazarus of Bethany, for instance, was raised from the dead by Jesus; he lived and eventually, faced death again. But what makes Jesus' death Good News is that his body was raised to live forever! The tomb, that first day of the week, was empty to the amazement of the women.

Brothers and sisters, as Christians, we are part and parcel of those who hold firmly to the good news we received and accepted. Lent season is for all of us a good time to pass it on to those around us. Let's tell them that Christ died for our sins, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures. Since our Lord was raised once for all and lives for eternity, we who hold firmly to our faith in Him, will be raised from the dead and will live eternally with our Lord. This is the good news!
